

# RAÚL LOAYZA-MURO

Raul is Associate Professor at the Department of Biology and Director of the Laboratory of Ecotoxicology in the Faculty of Science and Philosophy at the Universidad Peruana Cayetano Heredia. Since 2005, he has investigated the effects of UV radiation, acid drainage and metals on the biota of high-altitude Andean aquatic ecosystems; the use of bioindicators and biomarkers of water quality; and water and soil remediation systems through native flora and artificial wetlands. He is Principal Investigator of the Newton Funded CASCADA Project, where he studies the processes that determine the acidification of the Cordillera Blanca basins and their impacts on aquatic biodiversity and water quality.
